### **NURSES' ISSUES AFFECT US ALL**

The causes championed by ONC nurses and, indeed, all union nurses, are issues that have a direct impact on the patients, families, and communities we serve.

#### **SAFE STAFFING**

ONC is committed to pressuring hospitals and lawmakers to enact safe staffing requirements with nurse-to-patient ratios and the elimination of mandatory overtime. It has been proven that patient outcomes are greatly improved when a nurse is not assigned more patients than they can safely care for.

#### **WORKPLACE VIOLENCE**

The most recent study conducted by the U.S. Department of Labor reported that 13 percent of days away from work in the health care and social assistance sectors were due to workplace violence. The ONC is committed to stamping out violence against nurses, because no one should fear for their safety when helping patients heal.
